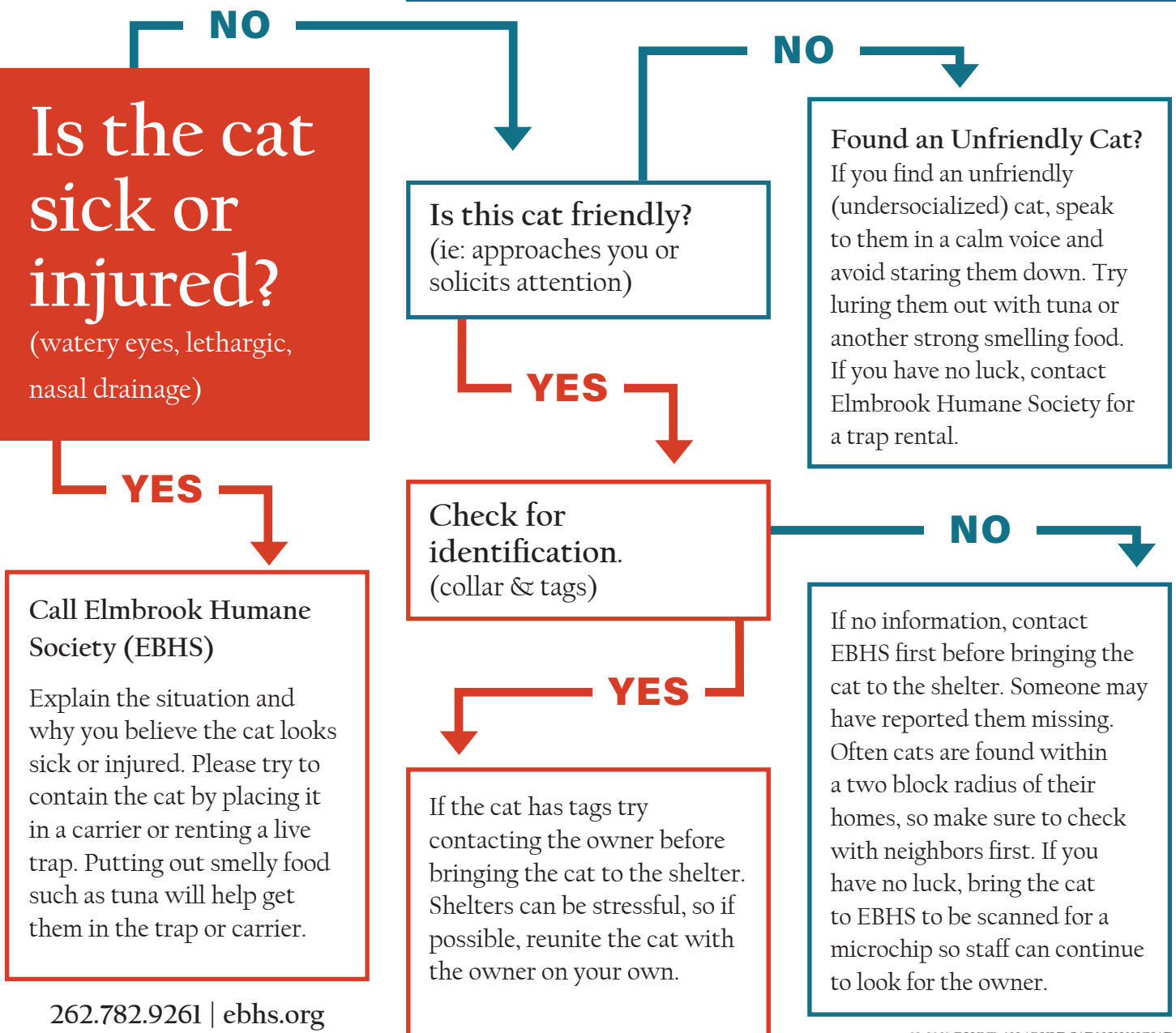




I Found An Adult Cat! What Should I Do?

The first thing to do is assess the situation. Does the cat look healthy or injured? Is the cat fearful or friendly? This information will help you determine next steps.



Is the cat sick or injured?

(watery eyes, lethargic, nasal drainage)

YES

Call Elmbrook Humane Society (EBHS)

Explain the situation and why you believe the cat looks sick or injured. Please try to contain the cat by placing it in a carrier or renting a live trap. Putting out smelly food such as tuna will help get them in the trap or carrier.

Is this cat friendly?
(ie: approaches you or solicits attention)

YES

Check for identification.
(collar & tags)

YES

If the cat has tags try contacting the owner before bringing the cat to the shelter. Shelters can be stressful, so if possible, reunite the cat with the owner on your own.

Found an Unfriendly Cat?

If you find an unfriendly (undersocialized) cat, speak to them in a calm voice and avoid staring them down. Try luring them out with tuna or another strong smelling food. If you have no luck, contact Elmbrook Humane Society for a trap rental.

NO

If no information, contact EBHS first before bringing the cat to the shelter. Someone may have reported them missing. Often cats are found within a two block radius of their homes, so make sure to check with neighbors first. If you have no luck, bring the cat to EBHS to be scanned for a microchip so staff can continue to look for the owner.
